





So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.


Basic Truths

The numbers

- The typical U.S. Congregation draws an adult crowd that's 61% female, 39% male. This gender gap shows up in all age categories.
- On any given Sunday there are 13 million more adult women than men in America's churches.



The numbers

- As of June 2022, 36 percent of women say they went to church last week (either in person or online) whereas only 24 percent of men did.
- Midweek activities often draw 70 to 80 percent female participants.



The numbers

- Christian universities are becoming convents. The typical Christian college in the U.S. enrolls almost 2 women for every 1 man.
- Fewer than 10% of U.S. churches are able to establish or maintain a vibrant men's ministry.

How did we get here?

- When did it all start?
- As early as the 13th century
- 17th century in America –

"There are far more Godly Women in the World than Godly Men...I have seen it without going a Mile from home, That in a Church of Three or Four Hundred Communicants, there are but a few more than One Hundred Men, all the Rest are Women."

How did we get here?

 Historian Richard D. Shields stated that 59 percent of all new members from 1730 to 1769 were women. The figures for southern churches were the same. In 1792, 'southern women outnumbered southern men in the churches (65 to 35) though men outnumbered women in the general population (51.5 to 48.5).

How did we get here?

- 1899 Cortland Myers writes a book "Why Do Men Not Go To Church?"
- The New York Times finds a few years later that 69% of worshippers in Manhattan are women
- Muscular Christianity



Why did we need to know that?

- The bridal/feminine imagery continued into the modern age
- Became synonymous with the Christian church
- A "personal relationship" with Jesus is tough for men to imagine



So what?

- If the congregation is mostly women...
- Then the church caters to women...
- Which keeps men away...
- Etc. etc.
- Men lack purpose, get sidelined





- Do we want men in church?
- Do we NEED men in church?




Galatians 3:27-29

Partnering together with another group or individual to complete a task with the understanding that THEY are ultimately responsible for the outcome and you are only responsible for your role or task.


1 Corinthians 11:2-7
